"It's unfortunate because that money comes out of the classrooms," she said.

Other members of the team include John Trittipio, architect for Trittipio Architecture and Planning, and Glynn Hoekstra of Barnhart Construction Management.

CHP overtime work on Covenant roads netting results

The California Highway Patrol has handed out more than 1,000 in the Covenant citations in "off times."

In October 2004, the RSF Association entered into a Reimbursable Services Agreement that provided "additional traffic enforcement" in the Covenant. This agreement allowed for CHP officers to work up to 20 hours of overtime in the Covenant.

"We asked that they devote 90 percent of their time to speeding and 10 percent to parking enforcement," said Liz Avalon, Association assistant planner.

The agreement costs the Association \$86,996 per year, according to the Road and Traffic Committee.

At the end of 2005 a total of 1,031 contacts were made with 905 ending with a citation being issued. Of those 905 citations, 96 percent were for "moving
